NEIGHBORHOOD MATCHING GRANT APPLICATION

Walla Walla residents who want to strengthen their neighborhood and community engagement can apply for City funds to help carry out a specific project, event, or program in their area. The Neighborhood Engagement Grant is provided by the City of Walla Walla to support grassroots action in local neighborhoods. The purpose of this grant is to enable Walla Walla residents to complete projects that address both a specific community need *and* support the community to take action.

Grant amounts can vary from \$100 to \$500. Final grant amounts will be determined by City staff. The purpose of this grant is to help get your project started; **the program is not intended for continual or annual support.** Examples of application projects that may qualify include: a neighborhood block party; a community clean-up project; a neighborhood garden or tree planting program; a neighborhood newsletter; an issue-oriented workshop; or a traffic calming project. Neighborhood Match

At the core of this Neighborhood Engagement Program Grant is the community match, which **requires grant recipients to match at least half of their funding request** with contributions from the community.

Contributions that will count toward this match requirement include:

- **Volunteer time:** Neighbors can contribute their personal time to planning for, organizing, or setting up an event. Volunteer time is valued at \$20/hour.
- **Donated items:** All donated materials, food, and supplies can be valued at their retail price.
- **Donated professional services:** All donations of professional services can be valued at their customary rate, up to a maximum of \$100/hour.
- **Cash:** Cash donations from individuals, organizations, or businesses can also be counted towards match requirements. *

*These donations are not tax deductible.
